

EMBERTON PARISH COUNCIL – NEWS FROM THE JUNE 2026 MEETING

CRIME FIGURES 7/5/26 TO 8/6/26 – Crime figures for Emberton provided by PCSO Jo Clarke for the period 7/5/26 to 8/6/26 were as follows: 1 X criminal damage (to tree), 1 x theft from vehicle (horse box). Other incidents not crime related were vehicle driving dangerously on the A509.

PARISH RELATED ISSUES – The parish council continues to monitor and report, where necessary, potholes and repairs needed to the highway such as refreshing the yellow lines in Olney Road. The Traffic Order for changes to the double yellow lines in the High Street, which was approved by MKCC highways in November 2025, has now been highlighted with the Ward Councillors due to MKCC failing to respond to the parish council with a date for the works to be undertaken.

PARKING – The parish council accepts that parking in the village is difficult for residents but would like to request that consideration and thought is given to drivers parking on bends and in the bus stopping area outside The Institute.

WIND FARM COMMUNITY BENEFIT FUND - Damon Fox, Philanthropy Manager at MK Community Foundation, has been in touch with the parish council to confirm the new MK Wind Farm Fund is available to receive applications from local groups in eight Parish Councils including Emberton. Wherever possible the grants made should be related to renewable energy, but should applications of this nature not be forthcoming, the Foundation can consider funding other types of projects within their general remit. These include No Poverty, Good Health & Well-being, Reduced Inequalities, Sustainable Cities and Communities and Climate Action.
